LAMB OF GOD

Today's Gospel invites us to stand beside John the Baptist and look at Jesus with fresh eyes. John's words are not mere titles; they are revelations. To call Jesus the Lamb of God is to acknowledge the depth of God's love — a love that liberates, heals, and restores. To see the Spirit rest on Jesus is to recognize the dawn of a new creation. And to hear John testify that Jesus is the Son of God is to be invited into a relationship of trust and discipleship.

There's a moment in today's Gospel that feels almost cinematic. John the Baptist sees Jesus approaching and proclaims, *"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."* It's as if the entire Old Testament, all of Israel's longing, all of humanity's searching, converges into that single sentence.

Reflection on today's Gospel

The main events of Christmastide are now behind us, and until Lent, we follow the Sundays of 'Ordinary Time'. The Christmas season has just closed, yet the readings refuse to let the mystery fade.

This Second Sunday in Ordinary Time returns to the event of Jesus' baptism and always feels like a quiet but decisive turning point in the liturgical year.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist recognises in Jesus the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. John bears witness that Jesus truly is the Son of God. The Gospel presents John the Baptist pointing toward Jesus with a clarity and humility that still unsettles us: "*Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.*" John's entire life narrows into this single gesture — a finger pointing away from himself and toward Christ. It's a moment of profound self-emptying, and it invites us to examine the subtle ways we cling to our own importance.

This Sunday is less about doing more and more about *becoming transparent* — letting Christ's light pass through us without distortion. John the Baptist shows that the most powerful witness is often the simplest: a life aligned so fully with God that others can see Christ through it.
